

CHÂTEAU DE BRISSAC

“Rosé d’Anjou” – Loire Valley, France



TECHNICAL NOTES

Sub-region: Brissac-Quincé

Alcohol: 11% by vol.

Varietal: 100% Grolleau Noir

The vineyards that produce these slightly off-dry rosés lie between the coastal town of Nantes and the heart of the Loire Valley in Tours. Wines from the d’Anjou appellation are by law off-dry. The native Grolleau Noir grape – only found in the Loire Valley.

TASTING NOTES

With a pretty-in-pink robe, this easy drinking rosé features a bouquet of red berries and candy notes. On the palate, a plump core of strawberry and white cherry is framed by a lightly tangy edge of watermelon rind and a slight minerality.

SUGGESTED FOOD PAIRINGS

Perfect for enjoyment alone, as an apéritif but also a great match for salads, charcuterie, or your favorite sushi.

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
